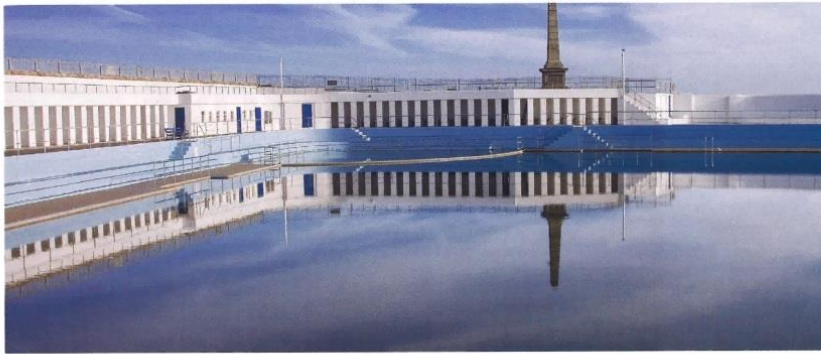

48 HOURS IN... Penzance

Long overlooked in favour of Cornwall's glossier locations, Penzance is swiftly becoming the region's hottest destination with incredible food, boutique hotels and a thriving art scene

Britain's Best B&B

Chapel House (chapelhousepz.co.uk) is no ordinary bed and breakfast. Voted Britain's best by *The Sunday Times* it's an interior lovers' dream. It has been a labour of love for owner Susan Stuart, and her painstaking renovation of Chapel House – one of Penzance's most loved historic buildings – is very impressive. All six luxurious bedrooms overlook the sea and dinner (on Friday and Saturday nights) is cooked and served

'super club style' by Susan in her large open plan kitchen/dining room. Breakfast is a particularly lavish affair, with piles of sourdough toast and pasties to choose from, big jugs of freshly made smoothies and a stupendous fry up.

Fish Supper

The Shore (theshorereastaurant.uk) – an unassuming but elegant little 28-seater fish restaurant – is arguably at the heart of

Penzance's foodie renaissance. Amazingly, owner Bruce Rennie does everything in the kitchen single-handedly, from baking his own sourdough to constructing intricate desserts and even making homemade pickles. Although other options are available, you really have to try the fish here, shipped in daily from Newlyn Market.

Sink a Pint

Lovers of traditional British boozers will have a whale of a time in Penzance; the town is packed with cosy and quirky pubs, serving fantastic food and even better beer. **The Turks Head Inn** (turksheadpenzance.co.uk) is great for lunch or dinner, while the **Admiral Benbow** is worth a visit purely to see the fascinating collection of maritime artefacts displayed on the walls. For a slightly trendier scene, the **Lamp & Whistle** is an Aladdin's cave of craft beer.

Go Independent

Penzance has loads of interesting little boutiques and shops to explore (especially on Chapel Street), as well as a thriving deli scene. You'll struggle to find a better Cornish pasty than the perfectly made beauties served up at **Lavenders Deli Bakery** (lavendersdelibakery.co.uk), while The Cornish Hen Deli serves up fabulous cakes, coffee and sandwiches, as well as local meats and cheeses. For an excellent selection of wine, beers and spirits check out Mounts Bay Wine Co, a gem of a shop tucked away from the main drag of the high street with thoroughly friendly knowledgeable staff.

A Living Art Gallery

Tucked away in the old quarter of Penzance in a historic Georgian House, the Artist Residence is another stunning boutique hotel that will wow lovers of modern design. Decked out with vibrant pop art, rustic wooden walls and quirky furniture, this stylish bolthole is also incredibly cosy, with welcoming staff and plenty of tucked-away nooks and crannies. For dinner, head downstairs to **The Cornish Barn** (thecornishbarn.co.uk) smokehouse to feast on succulent beer can chicken, buttery garlic prawns and smoked pork belly ribs.

Go Outdoors

Penzance is a fantastic base for outdoor exploring. **The Jubilee Pool** (jubileepool.co.uk) – Penzance's much-celebrated Art Deco lido – has only just re-opened after being battered by storms in 2014. And for culture lovers, **The Minack Theatre** (minack.com) is a world famous open-air theatre, carved into the granite cliff and set in glorious gardens overlooking the panorama of Porthcurno Bay.
